Moving from one foster family to another only added to the uncertainty. But the hardest part was growing up without love, where emotional, physical, and mental abuse created a monster in my mind. That darkness could have trapped me forever, but I fought my way out. No matter how poorly people treated me or looked down on me, I held onto my character, determined to preserve my sanity. With the help of God, I trusted my intuition and followed the light, even when fear tried to pull me back. That light was MCNP-ISAP, the beacon that saved me from losing all hope.

Thanks to their scholarship, I earned my degree—even though I didn't initially have a passion for the course I took. But I knew it was a necessary step toward realizing my dreams. MCNP-ISAP didn't just support my education—they clothed me, believed in me, admired me, and helped me discover my potential. They built my confidence and helped me believe in myself. They embraced me as a family and made me an inspiration to others. They did not just grant me an education but also helped me start and train by offering me work in

the administration after graduation. This opportunity allowed me to earn money for my board exam. After I passed, in God's grace, they absorbed me as an adviser/teacher. I later left to serve a mission for 18 months for the church I belong to. (During my mission, I regularly sent greeting cards to Ma'am Wilma, Ma'am Viva, and MCNP.) After my mission, I had the chance to work in a big company. But I am physically frail, and this became my setback. I work hard, but my body sometimes gives up. However, with the degree and the previous experiences I had through the help of my alma mater, I always had the advantage in job applications. My training in college became my bridge, allowing me to be considered by clients and employers, and giving me opportunities that I might not have had otherwise. Today, that degree has opened doors for me, allowing me to establish connections abroad while still being here in the Philippines. My drive to escape poverty pushed me to find my path, but without MCNP-ISAP, none of this would have been possible. They were the ladder that lifted me to where I am now. While I may not hold a high position in government or large agencies like some others, I am proud of how far I've come. I am already providing for myself and for the family I am starting to build. Life has had its setbacks, but my gratitude for MCNP is eternal. Although I am still working to rebuild what was lost in those tough years, I constantly think about how I can give back.

One day, I hope to sponsor a grantee, just as MCNP once believed in me. Now may not be the time, but the values of helping others and expressing gratitude were instilled in me by MCNP. I owe so much to those who believed in me and helped me grow my wings to soar. I love MCNP, and I love the Guzman family. They treated me like their own. I pray that they remain healthy and productive, and continue to grow so that many more dreams will be realized, more wings will be strengthened, and more achievers will rise.

My story is quite long but not enough to express how lucky to be a grantee and also meet the Guzman family. Thank you for this chance to express how deeply

grateful I am. Me now: I just realized, I have no photos (with colleagues at work, or charities attended) saved in my phone. So, the one I am sharing here is the fruit of my success. # **CARVING DESTINY:**

# How Determination, Resilience, and Education Altered My Fate

am *Eunice Angihan Pagaddut*, a proud former student-grantee of MCNP-ISAP from 2014 to 2018, where I pursued a Bachelor of Science in Social Work. This is the story of my journey, the challenges I faced, the lessons I learned, and the path that led me to where I am today.

Destiny is indeed a matter of choice, a lesson that has resonated deeply within my heart through the journey of my life. My narrative began in a remote village in Nueva Vizcaya, where I was raised amidst the challenges of poverty and the absence of basic amenities like electricity and concrete roads. At just four years old, I lost my father, and my mother's vision gradually faded, leaving our family struggling to survive. My brothers were entrusted to our relatives while I remained in my mother's care, witnessing firsthand the sacrifices she made to provide for us.

The harsh realities of our situation ignited a fierce determination within me. Completing elementary school was an achievement in itself. Yet, my mother urged me to abandon further education and consider an early marriage, a common path in our village. But I dreamed of something greater. I yearned for a college degree, not just for myself but for my mother and future generations. However, dreams often seem impossible when resources are scarce.

However, a glimmer of hope appeared in the form of my cousin, who welcomed me into her home and gave me the chance to continue my high school education. In return, I helped with household chores. Leaving my mother and the familiarity of home was heartbreaking, but I knew this was the price of my dreams. The whispers from home, accusations that I was selfishly "enjoying" life elsewhere while my mother suffered, still echo vividly in my memory. However, those words only fueled my determination to prove that my pursuits were not born out of enjoyment but rather a resolute commitment to a brighter future.

Life, however, had more trials in store. The most devastating of all was my mother's passing due to a lack of medical care in May 2014. The dream I held so dearly, to give her a better life, was shattered. But even in the depths of grief, I refused to surrender to despair. Instead, I turned my pain into purpose

It was during this time of profound loss that a new opportunity emerged. The Medical Colleges of Northern Philippines - International School of Asia and the Pacific (MCNP- ISAP) became my saving grace.



The institution not only provided me with free tuition but also ensured I had food and accommodations while taking my college degree. This generosity lifted an immense burden, allowing me to focus on my studies. It was here that I found a new home, a place that nurtured both my academic and personal growth. Away from home, I turned to faith, seeking comfort in God. The solitude became a blessing, allowing me to strengthen my spiritual connection and pursue my education without fear of judgment.

Balancing academics with the responsibilities of a working student was not easy, but my determination never wavered. The support from my alma mater, combined with the unwavering determination and resilience that had carried me through my darkest moments and the support of some of my relatives, propelled me forward. Eventually, I achieved what

once seemed impossible: in 2018, I graduated and passed the Licensure Examination for Social Workers, officially earning the title of Licensed Professional Social Worker.

That same year, MCNP-ISAP extended yet another opportunity by employing me as office staff at the Community Extension Office, where I served for eleven months. This experience not only allowed me to give

back to the institution that had given me so much but also prepared me for greater challenges ahead. The school gave me the confidence and foundation to extend my wings, empowering me to take my skills as a Social Worker beyond its walls and into institutions where my impact could grow.

Today, I stand as a Social Welfare Officer II at the Department of Social Welfare and Development -National Capital Region (DSWD-NCR), assigned to Marillac Hills. My journey has taken on a profound purpose: to extend the very hope and resilience that once carried me through the darkest of times to the survivors of abuse and exploitation. Through empathy, care, and unwavering dedication, I offer a and to them, affirming that their stories are not defined by their past and struggles but rather by their unbreakable spirit and resilience. Beyond my profession, I now have the privilege of supporting my family, particularly my younger brother in his college education, an opportunity I once fought so hard to attain for myself. The cycle of poverty that once seemed inescapable has been disrupted, replaced with a legacy of perseverance and empowerment.

As I reflect on my journey, I realize that determination,





resilience, and education have been the catalysts that reshaped my destiny. Standing at the intersection of my past and present,

I see how the barriers that once confined me have been shattered. My story proves that education can change lives, that resilience gives us strength, and that determination allows us to shape our future. It is a reminder that no matter the challenges we face, we have the power to build our dreams into reality.

I owe much of my transformation to MCNP-ISAP and my supportive relatives, whose generosity not only granted me access to education but also eased the burden of financial hardship, allowing me to focus on my dreams. Their kindness and unwavering support became the foundation upon which I built my future, and for that, I am eternally grateful. Without the opportunities they provided, I would not be where I am today.

and that He will never leave you nor forsake you.


And also, the school will always be here to guide and support you all throughout your journey in this institution.
